

HIDES AGONY FROM SISTER.

With His Leg Crushed, a Young Boule Whistles as She Comes Near.

NEW ROCHELLE, N. Y., June 10.—While he was being carried to an ambulance with his right leg nearly blown off by a soda water tank explosion at Glen Island to-day, Robert Boule, 16 years old, of New Rochelle, began to whistle "Here Comes My Daddy Now," when he was told that his sister was approaching.

The ruse worked, for his sister, thinking he was only slightly hurt, spent the rest of the day with her friends.

Boule was charging with compressed air the soda water tank at the Beach Lawn, when it exploded. He was taken to the New Rochelle Hospital, where his leg was amputated.
